The Stride Centre in MacGregor is committed to ensuring the health and safety of our user groups and staff. This document will remain fluid and may change at any time in order to follow changes to Manitoba Public Health Orders.

The MacGregor Stride Centre and the Municipality of North Norfolk is not responsible for any fines incurred by users or spectators for not following the Manitoba Public Health Orders as well as the return to Play guidelines by the user group's provincial sport body. (if applicable)

**Masks:** All spectators, participants and staff are required to wear masks upon entry into this facility. At this time, participants, coaches, instructors are not required to wear a mask when on the ice.

**Proof of Vaccine Requirements:** Effective September 6, 2021 new Manitoba Public Health Orders require all individuals **18 years of age or older** to be fully vaccinated in order to enter the Stride Centre in MacGregor facility.

The province's vaccination requirement currently does not include individuals between the ages of 12-17 related to youth sports. Starting September 6, 2021, all individuals must check in when entering the facility. Individuals will be required to show proof of full immunization (2 doses of Health Canada approved COVID – 19 vaccine received at least 2 weeks prior to the date of visit to the Stride Centre in MacGregor facility) and photo ID.

Children under the age of 18 years of age must be accompanied by a fully immunized care giver who is 18 years of age or older. Participants who cannot be accompanied by a parent or guardian will be the responsibility of their individual coach or team manager while in the facility.

#### **Arrival and Capacity Limitations:**

- Any staff, players, coaches, officials or parents who are feeling ill and showing Covid-19 symptoms must stay home and not enter the facility
- Entrance will be through the main doors only
- Participants, coaches, referees, officials, instructors will be allowed entry into the facility **30 minutes** prior to the scheduled ice time
- It is recommended that players younger than the age of 13 arrive at the facility dressed in the appropriate equipment. This will minimize the time required for the parent to assist in final stages of preparation (tying of skates) in the dressing room area
- Spectators will be allowed entry into the facility **15 minutes** prior to the scheduled ice time
- Upon entry into the building, participants to proceed to the designated dressing room and spectators are to proceed to the arena seating area. Spectators and/or participants will not be allowed to congregate in the lobby/viewing area of either facility.
- To eliminate congestion, spectators and participants are to exit the facility through the designated arena exit immediately following an on-ice session.
- When entering the facility, continue to exercise social distancing of 2 meters whenever possible

#### **General Information:**

- Dressing rooms are to be vacated no longer than 30 minutes after an on-ice session
- ALL ice bookings must be through the Facility Manager at 204-685-2202 (during working hours) or via email at [normaccentre@gmail.com](mailto:normaccentre@gmail.com)
- The renter is responsible for the actions of their group or members
- Guests of the facility will find hand sanitizer throughout the facility for use and guests will be **required** to use the sanitizer
- Signage will be posted, guests will follow the signs

- Participants must not leave any equipment anywhere in the arena. They must take equipment from dressing room right out of the building
- At the conclusion of the ice rental, any outside viewing spectators will exit the facility through the wheel chair ramp or any other side door

### **Concession**

- Concession will follow the guidelines following provincial restaurant guidelines

### **Cleaning/Sanitizing**

- Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the facility and users are **required** to use it. Hand sanitizer will be available in all dressing rooms, time-keeper box, lobby, seating area and washrooms as well as the arena staff room
- Regular cleaning of high touch areas, hand railings, door knobs, light switches, elevator etc will be conducted by facility staff on a regular basis
- Teams will assist facility staff by encouraging frequent hand washing and hand sanitizing as well as avoiding touching surfaces wherever possible
- Washrooms will be cleaned and sanitized frequently by facility staff
- Dressing room will be cleaned and sanitized between every user group

### **Curling**

- Curlers must stay home when ill and users are not allowed entry if they are ill with COVID-19 symptoms
- Curlers are not to arrive more than 10 minutes before their draw.
- Upon entering the curling ice, all curlers will use hand sanitizer
- All stones must be sanitized at the start of each draw by the curler with sanitize wipes (provided)
- Curlers must exit the premises 20 minutes after their last draw.

### **Full Facility's Capacity**

- Dressing Rooms 1,2,3,4 – 20 people
- Refs room - 6
- Hockey Ice – 100 plus
- Dressing room Zero - 32 people
- Upstairs Viewing Area - 200
- Outside Viewing Area - 100
- Down Stairs - tying skates area - 50
- Curling side - upstairs viewing area - 20
- Curling side - down stairs view area - 20
- Curling Ice - 48
- Cross Country Ski Room – 10
