Introduction

This document is intended to guide staff, volunteers and users of the Oakbank Community Club and the Hazelridge Sports Complex. The goal is to ensure the facilities and user groups are in compliance with the current guidelines set out by the province of Manitoba.

Novel Coronavirus and COVID-19

COVID-19 stands for Corona Virus Disease. COVID-19 spreads through direct contact with the respiratory droplets of someone who is infected with the virus. These droplets can spread up to two meters/six feet. It may be possible for a person to get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes.

Symptoms of COVID-19 are like other respiratory illnesses including the flu and common cold. Common symptoms for COVID-19 include: fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat and painful swallowing, stuffy or runny nose, loss of sense of smell, headache, muscle aches, fatigue, and loss of appetite although symptoms may vary from person to person. Some people may experience mild symptoms, while others have more severe symptoms. If you have COVID-19, or think you might have it, help prevent spreading it to others by self-isolating for 14 days from the start of your symptoms. If you are sick, stay home.

Arena Facility Protocols

- Proof of Double Vaccination is required for everyone 18 yrs of age and older, or proof from the Government of Manitoba that there is a medical reason for exemption

-Masks are Mandatory at all times except while on the ice or eating

1. All players/spectators must enter the building through the south main door.
2. Everyone 18 and older must provide proof of immunization as well as government-issued ID (ex. Driver's license, Health card) once inside the facility. Please be patient as we will have various staff and volunteers helping with this process.
3. No one is allowed to open any other door and let people in, unless approved by rink staff
4. Self-screening for coaches, instructors and participants must occur before entry into the facility. Please use the provincial screening tool available at <https://sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/> or in Interactive Voice Response (IVR) format at 1-877-308-9038. Please stay home if you or any of your household members are experiencing any symptoms.

5. Each facility user will be required to keep a list of the members of their group to ensure appropriate public health follow-up can take place if a participant is exposed to Covid-19.

7. There will be COVID-19 related signage throughout the Oakbank Community Club and Hazelridge Sports Complex facilities reminding patrons of physical distancing guidelines, hand hygiene, cough etiquette and mask wearing
8. The renter is responsible for the actions of their group or members.
9. All users must adhere to their Provincial Sport Association guidelines and Manitoba Health Guidelines.
10. Enter and exit the facility through the following doors:

Oakbank Community Club

South doors:

East door - All players/spectators will enter through the main door

West door – All spectators must exit through this door

East side door:

All players must exit using the north door on east side

Hazelridge Sport Complex

All participants/Spectators would enter through main entrance and exit through the players Entrance/Exit doors

While in the Building

1. Upon arrival, all coaches/instructors/participants/spectators are to use the hand sanitizer located at each entrance.
2. Coaches/instructors/participants must be given information on social distancing protocols, hand washing, etc.
3. Social distancing of 2 meters (6 feet) is recommended.
4. Ice users can enter the facility 30 minutes prior to their scheduled ice times.

Players/children running/playing in the hallway is not allowed

5. Ice users must exit the facility 30 minutes after their ice time is completed.
6. Maximum people in the stands = Spectators permitted up to 50% capacity (up to a maximum of 500 spectators) or as per specific facility requirements.
7. Congregating or standing in hallway is not currently permitted. Children/siblings playing in the hallway is not allowed
8. Water bottle station is available to be used but we encourage all users must bring their own labelled, pre-filled water bottle.
9. No spitting, fighting, or blowing noses without a tissue.
10. High contact surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized by facility staff. It is recommended that user groups bring their own sanitizer.

Leaving the Building

1. Participants must not leave any equipment anywhere in the arena including dressing rooms. Please assign one individual to check the room.
2. Participants leaving the dressing room will be asked to follow the signage to exit out of the arena.

The Municipality of Springfield, Oakbank Community Club and/or Hazelridge Sports Complex are not responsible for any fines incurred by users or spectators for not complying with the *Manitoba Health Restoring Safe Services* guidelines/public orders as well as the *Return to Play* guidelines provided by the user group's provincial sport body.

During this time, we expect everyone to observe all outlined safety guidelines. Any verbal abuse directed at the Staff, Volunteers or Board Members will be grounds for immediate removal from the facility.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we do our best to keep the arenas in Springfield safe.

If a Covid case is confirmed in either OBCC or HSC

1. If a positive case is found to have been in either or both rinks, everyone will be asked to leave the rink immediately. The rink will be closed for a minimum of 2 hours while the staff will thoroughly clean the entire facility.
2. Public health will be notified and the proper measures taken to alert the public
